THE STEPS WE FOLLOW FOR WORK IMPLEMENTATION

1. We first of all carriage out community identification and selection
2. Meeting with entire community were they all agreed that Apubeo a section of Nayorigo should be the beneficiary and they came out with ten household lists
3. We went back for the third meeting of beneficiaries of 10 and we discuss about the project and were the project is coming from and what is expected from the community.
4. The forth meeting was signing of agreement and contract forms and introduction of Artisan to beneficiaries and discusses on what the artisan is going to do and what support community will also give for the project to come on will.
5. The fifth meeting, Artisan, Landlord and DWST together selecting of set and setting out pit for digging. Now monitoring by DWST till project ends.

Identification and selection of beneficiaries

Implementation and outputs:

Total number of 10 substructure line with cover slabs and 9 successfully completed with superstructure but tow families have not being able to roof because they have no money to buy wood and premise to do that after the harvest. One is not with superstructure because the child was in the hospital for a long time and with rains now he is not able to build but will do that in the dry season.

We still have outstanding activities to undertake.

1. Hand washing and hygiene promotion training for beneficiaries and this will be than by Environmental Health Unity and they will take three thousand Ghana cedis for this program.
2. We also need to buy paint for the numbering of toilets
3. We still have to monitoring the remaining three to be completed

Challenges

The expected time for work completion was not realized because beneficiaries delayed in digging of pits which was not good. DWSTs has to go for monitoring all the time ,any time they were not at Nayriogo, beneficiaries stop working which was a big problem to understand.

Conclusion: issues recommendation

Poor sanitation, inadequate hygiene facilities and practices, and lack of potable water, especially in rural and poor urban areas, have been noted to result in increased water-related diseases in the country. In order to address this I wrote a paper on WATER SUPPLY CHALLENGES IN RURAL GHANA and I attended an international workshop on water and sanitation in Edinburgh.I met Jonathan Elphick and he warmly in visited me to Cambridge after reading my paper. When I arrived I meet his Lovely wife Lesley Elphick who warmly welcome me I was accepted to say with them, during my stay they organizers schools and friends around for me to give talks on my story about water and sanitation situations in my District Bongo. It's this back ground that some monies were raised for the construction of 10 household toilets for ten families in Nayorigo Apubeo.
